

# Preston , West Virginia

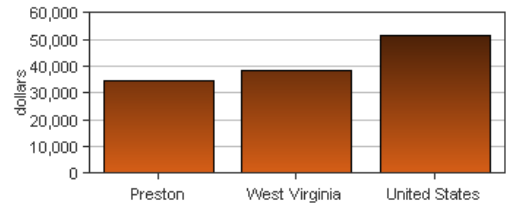
*Personal income last published on November 15, 2018.*

Preston is one of 55 counties in West Virginia. It is part of the Morgantown, WV Metropolitan Statistical Area. Its 2017 population of 33,679 ranked 16th in the state.

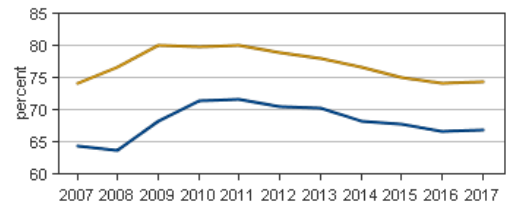
## Per Capita Personal Income

In 2017, Preston had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$34,542. This PCPI ranked 27th in the state and was 90 percent of the state average, \$38,479, and 67 percent of the national average, \$51,640. The 2017 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.1 percent from 2016. The 2016-2017 state change was 4.1 percent and the national change was 3.6 percent. In 2007, the PCPI of Preston was \$25,668 and ranked 29th in the state. The 2007-2017 compound annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.0 percent. The compound annual growth rate for the state was 2.7 percent and for the nation was 2.6 percent.

## Personal Income

In 2017, Preston had a personal income of \$1,163,330.0\*. This personal income ranked 18th in the state and accounted for 1.7 percent of the state total. In 2007, the personal income of Preston was \$840,448.0\* and ranked 19th in the state.

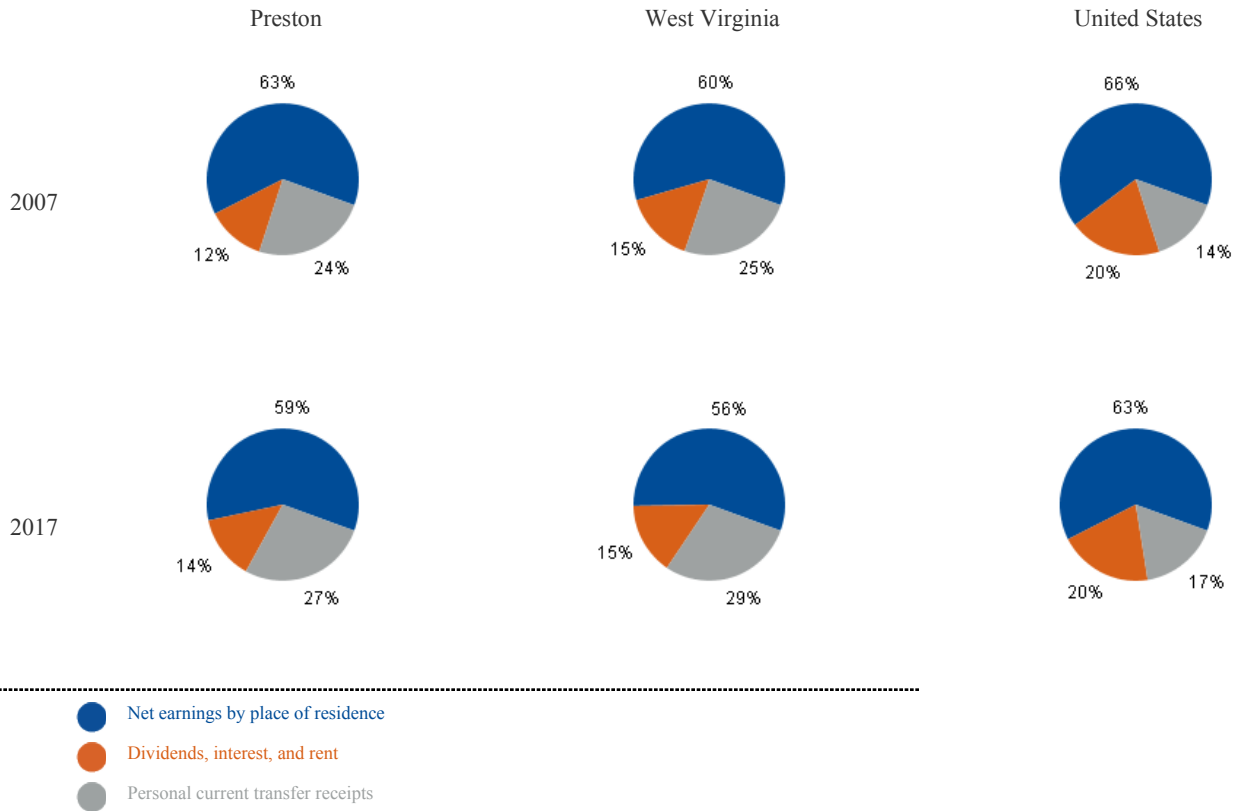
