

# **2020 West Virginia County Data Profile**

## **Wyoming County**

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This publication compiles three sets of data. The first set comes from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey, which includes data on selected Social, Economic, Housing, and Demographic characteristics. The second set is the labor force statistics from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, which includes data on Total Labor Force, Total Employment, Unemployment, and Unemployment Rate. The third set comes from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, which includes data on: Personal Income; Total Full-Time and Part-Time Employment; Compensation by Industry; Regional Income and Expenses; Transfer Payments; and Farm Income and Expenses.

Data containing industry break-down are presented in two sets. The first is presented in terms of the U.S. Standard Industrial Classification system (SIC) and the second is in terms of the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). The SIC data cover the years from 1969 to 2000, while the NAICS data cover the years from 2001 to 2019.



Wyoming is one of 55 [counties](#) in West Virginia. It is not part of a metropolitan area. Its 2019 population of 20,394 ranked 31st in the state.


### Per Capita Personal Income

In 2019, Wyoming had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$31,315. This PCPI ranked 51st in the state and was 74 percent of the state average, \$42,315, and 55 percent of the national average, \$56,490. The 2019 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.0 percent from 2018. The 2018-2019 state change was 2.7 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. In 2009, the PCPI of Wyoming was \$25,751 and ranked 39th in the state. The 2009-2019 compound annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.0 percent. The compound annual growth rate for the state was 3.0 percent and for the nation was 3.7 percent.

### Personal Income

In 2019, Wyoming had a personal income of \$638,645\*. This personal income ranked 33rd in the state and accounted for 0.8 percent of the state total. In 2009, the personal income of Wyoming was \$615,412\* and ranked 30th in the state.



Percent Contribution to Personal Income



## Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by Local Area

In 2019, Wyoming produced \$544,875 in [current-dollar total GDP](#)\*. This GDP ranked 36th in the state and accounted for 0.7 percent of the state total. In 2009, the total GDP of Wyoming was \$523,946 and ranked 31st in the state.

In 2019, Wyoming real GDP fell 7.2 percent; the 2018-2019 state change was 0.7 percent. The 2009-2019 compound annual growth rate for Wyoming real GDP was -1.0 percent; the compound annual growth rate for the state was 0.7 percent.

## Industry Composition

Goods- and services-producing industries and government comprise total GDP. Industry statistics reflect the value of goods and services produced by each of those industries located in Wyoming. In 2019, goods-producing industries produced the largest portion of GDP, while services-producing industries and government produced the second and third largest portion of GDP, respectively.
