This publication compiles three sets of data. The first set comes from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey, which includes data on selected Social, Economic, Housing, and Demographic characteristics. The second set is the labor force statistics from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, which includes data on Total Labor Force, Total Employment, Unemployment, and Unemployment Rate. The third set comes from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, which includes data on: Personal Income; Total Full-Time and Part-Time Employment; Compensation by Industry; Regional Income and Expenses; Transfer Payments; and Farm Income and Expenses.

Data containing industry break-down are presented in two sets. The first is presented in terms of the U.S. Standard Industrial Classification system (SIC) and the second is in terms of the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). The SIC data cover the years from 1969 to 2000, while the NAICS data cover the years from 2001 to 2019.



Hampshire is one of 55 counties in West Virginia. It is part of the Winchester, VA-WV Metropolitan Statistical Area. Its 2019 population of 23,175 ranked 27th in the state.


Per Capita Personal Income

In 2019, Hampshire had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$36,093. This PCPI ranked 34th in the state and was 85 percent of the state average, \$42,315, and 64 percent of the national average, \$56,490. The 2019 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.7 percent from 2018. The 2018-2019 state change was 2.7 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. In 2009, the PCPI of Hampshire was \$26,013 and ranked 37th in the state. The 2009-2019 compound annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.3 percent. The compound annual growth rate for the state was 3.0 percent and for the nation was 3.7 percent.

Personal Income

In 2019, Hampshire had a personal income of \$836,464*. This personal income ranked 27th in the state and accounted for 1.1 percent of the state total. In 2009, the personal income of Hampshire was \$619,628* and ranked 29th in the state.



Percent Contribution to Personal Income



Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by Local Area

In 2019, Hampshire produced \$369,235 in [current-dollar total GDP](#)^{*}. This GDP ranked 41st in the state and accounted for 0.5 percent of the state total. In 2009, the total GDP of Hampshire was \$310,194 and ranked 38th in the state.

In 2019, Hampshire real GDP grew 1.9 percent; the 2018-2019 state change was 0.7 percent. The 2009-2019 compound annual growth rate for Hampshire real GDP was -0.5 percent; the compound annual growth rate for the state was 0.7 percent.

Industry Composition

Goods- and services-producing industries and government comprise total GDP. Industry statistics reflect the value of goods and services produced by each of those industries located in Hampshire. In 2019, services-producing industries produced the largest portion of GDP, while government and goods-producing industries produced the second and third largest portion of GDP, respectively.
