

# Wyoming, West Virginia

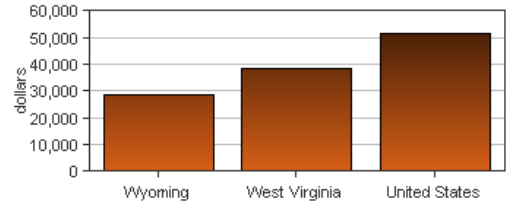
Personal income last published on November 15, 2018.

Wyoming is one of 55 counties in West Virginia. It is not part of a metropolitan area. Its 2017 population of 21,210 ranked 30th in the state.

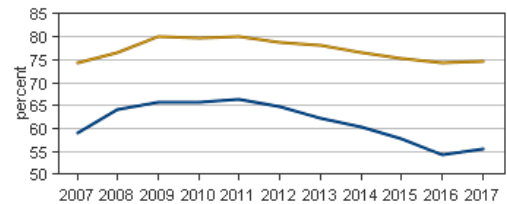
## Per Capita Personal Income

In 2017, Wyoming had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$28,635. This PCPI ranked 50th in the state and was 74 percent of the state average, \$38,479, and 55 percent of the national average, \$51,640. The 2017 PCPI reflected an increase of 5.6 percent from 2016. The 2016-2017 state change was 4.1 percent and the national change was 3.6 percent. In 2007, the PCPI of Wyoming was \$23,589 and ranked 42nd in the state. The 2007-2017 compound annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.0 percent. The compound annual growth rate for the state was 2.7 percent and for the nation was 2.6 percent.

## Personal Income

In 2017, Wyoming had a personal income of \$607,355.0\*. This personal income ranked 31st in the state and accounted for 0.9 percent of the state total. In 2007, the personal income of Wyoming was \$567,976.0\* and ranked 30th in the state.

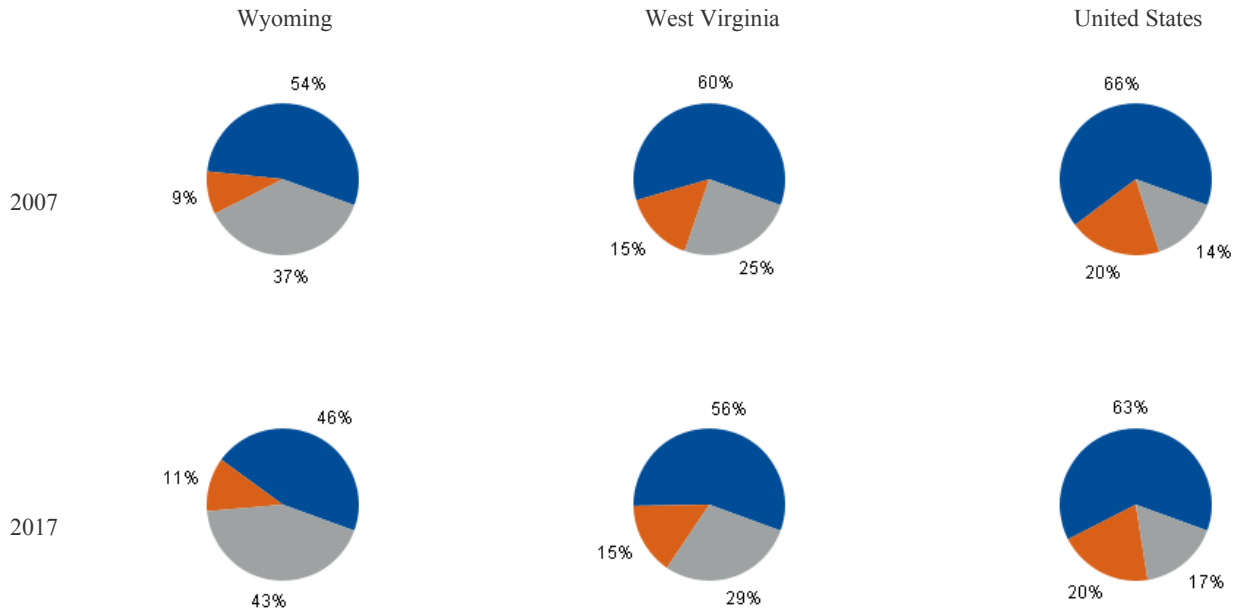
