

# 2019 West Virginia County Data Profile

## Pendleton County

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This publication compiles three sets of data. The first set comes from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey, which includes data on selected Social, Economic, Housing, and Demographic characteristics. The second set is the labor force statistics from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, which includes data on Total Labor Force, Total Employment, Unemployment, and Unemployment Rate. The third set comes from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, which includes data on: Personal Income; Total Full-Time and Part-Time Employment; Compensation by Industry; Regional Income and Expenses; Transfer Payments; and Farm Income and Expenses.

Data containing industry break-down are presented in two sets. The first is presented in terms of the U.S. Standard Industrial Classification system (SIC) and the second is in terms of the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). The SIC data cover the years from 1969 to 2000, while the NAICS data cover the years from 2001 to 2018.



Pendleton is one of 55 counties in West Virginia. It is not part of a metropolitan area. Its 2018 population of 6,997 ranked 53rd in the state.


## Per Capita Personal Income

In 2018, Pendleton had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$35,140. This PCPI ranked 31st in the state and was 86 percent of the state average, \$40,873, and 65 percent of the national average, \$54,446. The 2018 PCPI reflected a decrease of 0.3 percent from 2017. The 2017-2018 state change was 5.8 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 2008, the PCPI of Pendleton was \$28,885 and ranked 22nd in the state. The 2008-2018 compound annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.0 percent. The compound annual growth rate for the state was 2.7 percent and for the nation was 2.9 percent.

## Personal Income

In 2018, Pendleton had a personal income of \$245,876\*. This personal income ranked 50th in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 2008, the personal income of Pendleton was \$224,179\* and ranked 49th in the state.


